- -Hive Management: Monitor and treat for SHB and Mites. Varroa Mites will start to multiply now.
- If you plan for the 4x a year treatment of Mites: JAN, APRIL, JUNE, and Fall. Be SURE to read the directions if using Chemical strips.
- -The Red Maples are starting to bloom which starts our Spring here in Clay County. To know the difference in the Red, Silver and Swamp Maple see U-Tube Chuc Bees for the flowers. Time to get your Swarm Traps out by the first of FEB. Bate with Lemon Grass or Swarm Commander.
- -Apiary Report: we have 3 Longstroth Hives, 12 NUCS and 1 top Bar
- -Mentor Report: WE met inside due to weather with 12 folks present.
- Membership Chair: Approximately ½ of members Paid up for 2024, we are at 225 Members now!
