Dave welcomed Lizz Froelich and Dana. They have a beautiful and unusual presentation on German Beeswax Christmas Ornaments. Lizz is the Cofounder for European Art Wax. Started many years ago with her mother and starting a resurgence with Dana. She has been around beekeepers since she was a child. She uses silicone molds preferably; they seem to give the most detail. But there are rubber and antique wooden molds also. It is an old German tradition where they made ornaments and dolls. If they are placed near a heat source the ornaments will give off a honey scent. The ornaments are all beeswax shaped in molds in an 8 step process; filtered wax, painted, antiqued, gilded and glazed. They are hard and will hang as an ornament. If they break, she simply melts them down again which separates the paint from the wax and reforms them. She uses candle mold release on the forms, but it is not needed for the silicone forms. It takes approx. 4 hours for the wax to harden and more time for the paint and glaze to dry. We had so much interest that will try to set up a class for us. Dave can secure an entire Sat for our class when we have a date, cost \$25.

HIVE Management: Monitor for SHB and Mites 4 times a year vs 2 or 3. Ray noted that in the Apiary last Sat we used Powder Sugar and found 3 Mites in one hive and 13 in another. Mite treatments done in July also added Teatree oil to the Brood booster with Wintergreen oil. The Nectar flow is almost over for Fall so feed your hives. Winter is from Thanksgiving to DEC 26. Use this time for hive repair, paint, and upkeep.
